week. The rest of the time is to be devoted to non-contact aspects	
of teaching & learning, including programme development and	
reviews (estimated to average 10 hours per week), and research & publications.	
Staff in the higher education stream are expected to carry out	
research & publications in their fields. They are also expected to	
carry out approved consultancies.	
Staff in higher education stream may participate in professional,	
community, and outreach activities relevant to the programme or	
professional interests of the staff. Staff are also expected to	
participate in University-wide activities commensurate with the roles and responsibility of an academic.

	 At least 10 years of formal tertiary teaching and research/experience or a combination of education and commercial experience of at least 10 years at the commensurate level.
	Solid experience in programme development and review, and
	 A good record of publications in credible academic outlets.
	Applicants must for professorial rank have at least 15 single
	authored papers (or equivalent) in leading academic journals in
	the field and must display the standard characteristics of a
	professorial standing. For Associate professorship applicants must
	have at least 10 single authored papers (or equivalent) in leading
	academic journals in the field and must display the standard characteristics of a associate professorial standing.
Desirable	Preference will be given to applicants with work and/or teaching
Attributes	experiences in developing countries, and a demonstrated experience in dealing with sociocultural and political diversities.
Salary and	Cash remuneration (including Salary and Gratuity), starts at
