A representative from the Solomon Islands National University ing their masters and PhD studies at the Academy of Future (SINU) last month participated in the International Forum on Pacif- Ocean, and international students currently enrolled at Ocean ic Islands Countries Response to Climate Change (PICC 2023) recently held in Qingdao City, Shandong Province, China.

Dr. Lindon Havimana who is a current senior lecturer under the Fisheries Department at SINU attended the two days' event held from 21-22 October and did an eye-opening presentation on how coastal communities in Solomon Islands are responding to the impacts of climate change.

Dr. Havimana's presentation specifically focuses on food security and adaptation. Apart from the presentation, Dr. Havimana also cochaired one of the plenary sessions.

Dr. Havimana said although, the trip was his first to China, he said the experience he gained for the trip was superb and worth it where

The forum covered broad range of subjects including climate and ocean sciences, global environmental agreements, legal options for climate refuges, traditional knowledge and nature based solutions, significance of ecological process in carbon cycle and neutrality, offshore renewable energy, technology and structures toward attaining carbon neutrality and so forth.

The trip was made possible following the signing of a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between SINU and Ocean University of China back in May this year.

The two Universities have agreed to promote programs including the exchange of academic staff, joint research in ocean, fisheries and climate change.

Another area of their collaboration includes collaborating in joint international conferences, annual works and camps, and other academic and cultural exchanges of mutual interest and benefits.

The next group to benefit under the agreement will be Mr. Clarence Cheon, Miss. Serema Kwato'o and Miss. Shirlene Hiru, who are currently engaged by the Department of Fisheries Studies as research assistants.

The trio have been accepted to attend a short training on tackling climate change risks and protecting marine environment and will be traveling to Qingdao in China next week.
