An active learning, problem solving approach will be used to support the development of clinical reasoning and critical thinking needed in nursing practice. This will comprise of actual and simulated case scenarios, incidents, problems and projects that may be encountered by the nurses.

ENTRY CRITERIA:

The entry criterion for this degree is University Entrance. For the **RN pathway the entry criteria** is:

RN with a minimum of 2 years post registration practice plus;

- Completion of the Diploma of Nursing in SINU or equivalent
- Completion of Certificate of Nursing plus bridging programme or equivalent courses

Completion of other 3 year nursing programmes plus bridging or equivalent courses.

BRIDGING COURSE:

The bridging course is a pre-entry requirement for applicants to the Bachelor of Nursing programme whose preservice nursing programme is not to the academic level of the Diploma of Nursing at SINU that is a level 6 Diploma.

This requirement may be removed if the applicant has completed additional educational programmes to a Diploma level e.g. Diploma of Public Health.

In some circumstances applicants may be required to complete only part of this course.

Applicants seeking admission to the Bachelor of Nursing programme will be required to:

BACKGROUND:

The Midwifery practice and education has existed in Solomon Islands for some years, although the role and scope of the midwife has never been defined nor is there a register for Midwives. This situation is now being remedied at the present with the upgrading of the Advanced Diploma of Midwifery to Bachelor's degree Level, and the development of regulatory processes, competencies and scope of practice for the midwife.

In Solomon Islands the Midwife is a leadership role for nursing in the area of Reproductive Health care. This means that they may *practise in any setting including the home, community, hospitals, clinics or health units.*

This programme includes a 3 years Diploma of Nursing.

Enrolment into the Bachelor of Nursing (midwifery) does not occur until students have completed the Diploma of Nursing or equivalent, and have completed 2 years Registered Nurse practice.
