Background History

The Solomon Islands School of Nursing (SISN) was established in the early 1960's as one of the first Government institution of Nursing in Solomon Islands. At that time it was located at the National Referral Hospital compound and administered by the Ministry of Health and Medical Services (MHMS).

In 1984 it became the School of Nursing and Health studies (SNHS), when it was amalgamated with six (6) other schools and became part of the Solomon Islands College of Higher Education (SICHE), under the SICHE Act, 1984.

In 2010 following an Act of Parliament (SINU Act), SICHE becomes the Solomon Islands National University (SINU). The school then was known as The School of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences. SINU went through a structural review in 2019 and becomes the Faculty of Nursing Medicine & Health Sciences. It comprises of three schools; The School of Nursing, The School of Public Health & The School of Medicine.

Programme Aim

The aim of the Diploma of Nursing is:

To produce a well educated, competent graduates who:

- Are capable of delivering safe effective nursing care to individuals, families and communities in Solomon Islands and internationally
- Have the academic ability to proceed to higher levels of education and to contribute in a meaningful manner to health development in Solomon Islands

Length of Program

The Diploma of Nursing programme is a three year full time program, comprising of six (6) semesters of 18 weeks.

Entry Requirements

The Diploma of Nursing programme is open to both males and females. The entry requirements are as follows:

1. Normal Entry:



(a). Academic Requirements:

Applicants must have reached Form

6 and 7 within the Solomon Islands Secondary School System, with good passes in English, Mathematics

and Science.

(b). Age Requirements:

Applicants must have reached the age of 18 years by the time they are accepted into the programme. Candidates exceeding the age of 40 will not be admitted.

2. Health Requirements:

An acceptable level of physical and mental health is an essential pre-requisite for entry to the program. All accepted students will be required to undergo thorough medical examination prior to the commencement of the programme.

3. Personal Requirements:

Applicants applying to the nursing programme must have excellent attitude and behavior report from their respective career's master. Honesty, integrity and reliability are essential attributes for a successfully career in nursing.
