The Solomon Islands National University (SINU) invites applications for the position of **Assistant Professor in Public Health** within the Faculty of Nursing, Medicine and Health Sciences (FNMHS). The successful candidate will contribute to teaching, research, and service, supporting departmental goals and developing an independent research profile. The role involves delivering high-quality education, conducting applied public health research, and engaging with local and international stakeholders to address public health challenges.

Key Responsibilities

- Deliver lectures, tutorials, and workshops in public health (e.g., epidemiology, health policy, social determinants of health).
- Design and update courses, develop syllabi, and assess student learning in line with international standards.
- Supervise undergraduate and postgraduate research projects.
- Conduct high-quality public health research in areas such as infectious/non-communicable diseases, health systems, global health equity, or digital health innovations.
- Publish research in peer-reviewed journals and present at national and international conferences.
- Seek external funding and collaborate with government agencies, NGOs, and academic partners.
- Participate in faculty committees, program coordination, accreditation, and quality assurance activities.
- Mentor and advise students on academic and career pathways, and support outreach and public health advocacy programs.
